



Polish forests take
up 9.1 million
hectares, which is
29.4% of Poland's
territory.

Almost 80% of forests in Poland are
owned by the state.

70% of Polish forests have existed for
at least 100 years.

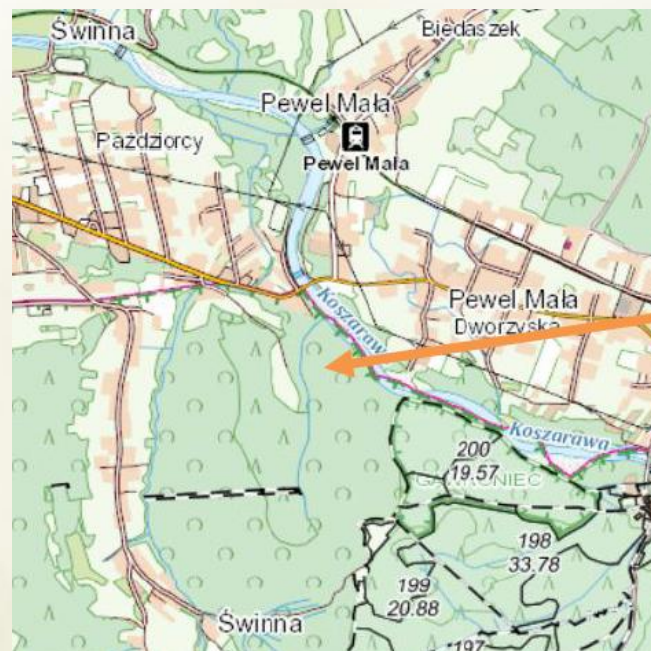
Over 60% of Polish forests have been
re-established by artificial means by
planting of seedlings.

In the last decade, forest operations
(cleaning, thinning, liberation cutting
etc.) were undertaken in 80% of
Polish trees.

Project plots in Poland

1. Oxbow lake forest – private old-growth forest

- Old spruce- beech forest (Dentario glandulosae-Fagetum)
- High biodiversity
- No-intervention forest



2. Adam's edible forest – private forest

- Private terrain
- Old overgrown orchard
- Transformation into edible forest

3. Juchowo forest – foundation-owned community forest

- Mature, sustainable forest with many species
- Beech-oak forest, waterlogged alder forest
- No-intervention forest
